- Language and employability starts at pre-school. Language status for all languages (influence from parents).
- Project on national curriculum: the comparison, similarities, difference and results for the future.
- Transitions and liaison between sectors (challenges):
 - There is a need for shared understandings
 - o Competing (rather than complementary) priorities in wider education
 - CH: New early start (pre-school)
 - NO: Pre-primary experience/exposure to languages. Lower to upper secondary disconnect and lack of progression. Secondary to university disconnect in proficiency and content. Develop local strategy, interpretational curriculum and how to implement locally.
 - AT: There is a need for shared use of terminology in different stages and across languages too.









- SE: Competition between schools and levels. Inter-agency support and networks help transitions.
- SCO: Dedicated time to facilitate such networks.
- NL: Competition between colleagues teaching different languages in the same department.
- HU: Manage parental expectations and increase motivation of students through cross-sector collaboration between teachers.
- All language learning at any level, contributes to literacy.
- The next meeting will take place in Copenhagen, in June 2023. Date to be confirmed.
